Aptly titled The Miranda, the lipstick-red leather design opens like an antique doctor's bag, complete with requisite compartments for her most important and personal objets . "I love a new medium and just learning the ins and outs of making a bag," July said of the design process, which she calls a collaboration between herself and fellow artist, Welcome Companions' Laurel Consuelo Broughton. A picture of July's son is tucked away (not really her son, but the thought is there) a \$20 bill for those cash-only bodega stops and a special nook for stray bobby pins all



are alreading of a lettering. The bag is a look into July's personal life, exposing a top-secret jump drive for inspiration, the homeopathic sleep aid she prefers, and a little cranny for a single almond, her snack of choice. And no July special project would be complete without her written charm. Look inside to find a pouch filled with small, multipurpose cards written in her wry language, promising to help diffuse any sticky social situation. They include a "Sadness Punch Card"; one that says, "I can't understand you because my cell phone has a bad connection, I'll have to call you back"; one with "Please use a lot of lubricant"; one that says, "In three seconds I'm going to burst into song and I'd like you to join me. The Miranda bag, \$1,500, is available for a limited time exclusively at Opening Ceremony stores.





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


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
